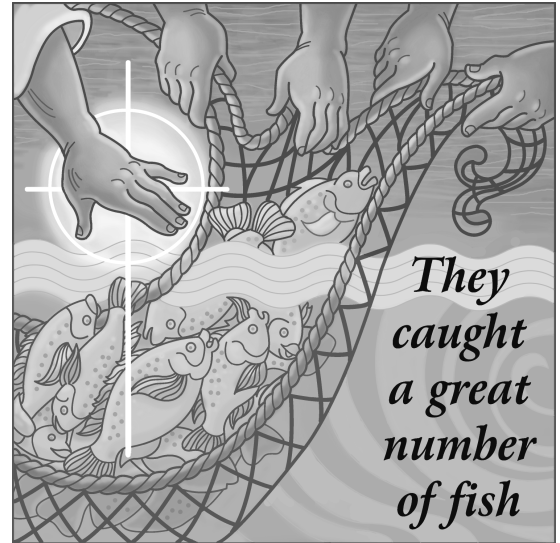

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time
GOD'S CALL

February 7, 2010

In today's scriptures we hear three instances of people receiving and responding to a call from God. These accounts follow the pattern of most scriptural call narratives: a divine presence appears and speaks; the person expresses fear or unworthiness, receives encouragement, and finally responds to God's call. Today's first reading shows an unworthy Isaiah responding to the Lord's call, "Here I am; send me!" (Isaiah 6:8). In the second reading Paul tells us that, even though he had persecuted the church, he was called to be an apostle. In the Gospel, despite Simon Peter's protest that he is a sinner, Jesus calls James, John, and Simon to follow him. They leave everything they have and follow Jesus—that is, they become Jesus' disciples. These scriptures can challenge us to take stock of our lives. Next Saturday and Sunday we will have Lenten reflection books available for those who want them. These little books give a reflection on each day of Lent starting with Ash Wednesday and going on till Easter. Books are in English and Spanish and we are asking a donation of \$1.00 for each book.

LITURGICAL PRACTICES

Archbishop Gomez has given us permission to restore some of the liturgical practices that were voluntarily set aside as a result of the H1N1 Influenza threat. Starting Ash Wednesday, we will distribute the Precious Blood at communion and resume— for those who prefer— the reception of the host on the tongue. We will also have the option of holding hands at the Lord's Prayer and the shaking of hands or embracing at the sign of peace, with the caveat, as always, that our people respect the concerns of those in our communities who don't feel comfortable participating in this manner. Eucharistic Ministers will continue to sanitize their hands before they distribute communion and those who have flu-like symptoms must abstain from taking the Precious Blood from the cup. If there is an increase in seasonal influenza during the next several weeks these policies may need to be revisited.

It is because of the sacrifice of our military men and women, past and present that we are able to enjoy the freedoms we have. These people are serving our country and deserve our support. MASS ON THE GRASS

Our Mass on The Grass festival will be on Sunday, May 2nd on the church grounds. The church needs this festival to help pay for future renovations. In order to make this event as successful as possible we will need the help of as many people as possible. Everyone is invited to come to the next meeting which will be on Thursday, February 11th in the school cafeteria .

NEW CAFETERIA POLICY

Due to the many problems we encountered by those who have used the cafeteria and/or kitchen in the recent past, the Pastoral Council has decided to place new rules on the usage of these facilities. Starting immediately all church and school organizations that use these facilities will pay the following charge(s):
\$50.00 dollars to use the kitchen
\$50.00 dollars to clean the kitchen
\$50.00 to clean the dining room and put the tables and chairs back in their proper place

Renters will only be charged for the area they use and full payment is due at the time the area is booked. Renters are also responsible for a general cleaning of the area they uses. All reservations and payments will be made at the rectory office. The money paid for use of the kitchen will be saved and used when a repair or replacement becomes necessary. This payment will not cover the entire cost of repairs and maintenance to the kitchen facilities but it will help a little .

PASTORAL COUNCIL

All pastoral council members are reminded of the next council meeting, which will be on Monday, February 15th, at 7:00pm in the library. The Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) assists, counsels, and advises the pastor and provides sound judgment on the direction of the parish, and in many cases provides crucial advice on difficult decisions that face our parish. The PPC is considered the leadership of the parish and serves as the voice for all parish ministries/organizations in an effort to promote a one "community parish family".
