PEOPLE OF THE RESURRECTION

In the past few weeks we have been hearing about the beginning of Jesus' ministry as written in the Gospel of Luke. Jesus began his ministry in the synagogue in Nazareth by reading, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me / because he has anointed me / to bring glad tidings to the poor" (Luke 4:18). With those words Jesus announced the whole purpose of his ministry. He himself was to bring the kingdom of God to the poor. This is the good news of salvation that he preached and brought about during his ministry.

Today we hear the Beatitudes, in which Jesus explains more fully what those "glad tidings" really mean. The good news is about salvation from suffering on earth and in the life to come. LITURGICAL PRACTICES

Archbishop Gomez has given us permission to restore some of the liturgical practices that were voluntarily set aside as a result of the H1N1 Influenza threat. Starting Ash Wednesday, we will distribute the Precious Blood at communion and resume— for those who prefer— the reception of the host on the tongue. We will also have the option of holding hands at the Lord's Prayer and the shaking of hands or embracing at the sign of peace, with the caveat, as always, that our people respect the concerns of those in our communities who don't feel comfortable participating in this manner. Eucharistic Ministers will continue to sanitize their hands before they distribute communion and those who have flu-like symptoms must abstain from taking the Precious Blood from the cup. If there is an increase in seasonal influenza during the next several weeks these policies may need to be revisited.

Ash Wednesday is this week, February 17.th The ashes we will receive become a way for us to publicly mark our sorrow for sin and to symbolically ready ourselves to cast our sin away and open ourselves to God during the weeks to come. On this day we will be having a mass at 8:15am, services at 10:15am, 12:15pm and 5:15pm and a mass at 7:00pm. Please make plans to come.

NEW CAFETERIA POLICY

Due to the many problems we encountered by those who have used the cafeteria and/or kitchen in the recent past, the Pastoral Council has decided to place new rules on the usage of these facilities. Starting immediately all church and school organizations that use these facilities will pay the following charge(s):

\$50.00 dollars to use the kitchen

\$50.00 dollars to clean the kitchen

\$50.00 to clean the dining room and put the tables and chairs back in their proper place

Renters will only be charged for the area they use and full payment is due at the time the area is booked. Renters are also responsible for a general cleaning of the area they use. All reservations and payments will be made at the rectory office. The money paid for use of the kitchen will be saved and used when a repair or replacement becomes necessary. This payment will not cover the entire cost of repairs and maintenance to the kitchen facilities but it will help a little .

REMINDERS FOR LENT

Abstinence is a penitential practice consisting of refraining from the consumption of meat and is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older. Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and the Fridays during Lent are days of abstinence. In addition to abstinence, fasting is to be observed by all Catholics between the ages of 18 – 59 years. On days of fasting, one full meal is allowed, two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed. If a person is unable to observe these regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self-denial that are suitable to their condition.

WORDS TO REFLECT ON

Being Like Jesus

Very often we distance ourselves from Jesus. We say, "What Jesus knows we cannot know, and what Jesus did we cannot do." But Jesus never puts any distance between himself and us. He says, "I call you friends, because I have made known to you everything I have learned from my Father" (John 15:15) and "In all truth I tell you, whoever believes in me will perform the same works as I do myself, and will perform even greater works" (John 14:12).

Indeed, we are called to know what Jesus knew and do what Jesus did.

Do we really want that, or do we prefer to keep Jesus at arm's length?

DID YOU KNOW

The Mass or the "liturgy" of the Eucharist is the "work" or "service" in the name of the people of God or on behalf of the people of God/us. In our Catholic tradition, we participate in the "work of God". How awesome! Jesus Christ suffered, died and rose to redeem us from our sinfulness. He now continues his work of redemption **in, with and through us**, his Church. Therefore, we are called to "conscious, active and fruitful participation" every Sunday or holyday. If we are moved to do more, we can participate and celebrate even on weekdays.
