**SJB RELIGIOUS EDUCATION**

Regular registrations for the 2010-2011 year will be held on Sunday, August 22<sup>nd</sup> from 9:00am to 1:00pm. The following is what we will be offering:

**Pre-K 4 and Kindergarten age children:** Classes are held on Sunday morning from 10:30 to 11:45am. Parents must pick up their children to attend the 12:00 noon Mass as part of their class. It is urged that parents attend this mass.

**1<sup>st</sup> thru 5<sup>th</sup> grade:** Classes are held on Sunday morning from 10:30 to 11:45am with Mass attendance at 12:00 noon. The Mass is part of their class. No child may be picked up prior to Mass. It is requested that the parents attend this mass if possible.

**6<sup>th</sup> thru 8<sup>th</sup> grades:** Classes are held on Sunday morning from 10:30 to 11:45am with Mass attendance at 12:00 noon. The continuing education in the Catholic Faith is essential in these formative years of our children. The children should attend Religious Education classes every year that they attend regular school.

**Baptism classes for children 6 and older:** Classes are held on Sunday morning from 10:30 to 11:45am. The children will attend the Liturgy of the Word at 12:00 noon and be dismissed after the homily to discuss the readings and the gospel. The children will be dismissed at 1:00pm.

**Communion classes:** Classes are held on Sunday morning from 10:30 to 11:45am. Attendance at the 12:00 noon Mass is part of the learning process for these classes. Parents are encouraged to attend this same Mass.

**Rite of Christian Initiation for adults:** Adults interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church, please contact Rosalinda Rodriguez in the Faith Formation office. The RCIA is a process that invites the baptized and un-baptized, non-Catholic and Catholic adults, who have questions about the Catholic Faith or wish to complete their sacraments of initiation. The process is individualized as much as possible to meet the needs and life experiences of each adult.

**CONFIRMATION**

We will be celebrating the sacrament of Confirmation on Saturday, May 22<sup>nd</sup> at 2:00pm with Bishop Cantu. All those who are to be confirmed as well as their god parents are asked to be at the church by 1:00pm. We are most grateful to Mrs. Rosalinda, our DRE, and all those who have been preparing our students for this special day.
