The Most Holy Trinity PRAISE TO THE CREATOR

Psalm 8 continues this hymn of praise to the Creator, enumerating all the wonders of creation, and marveling at the wonderful truth that God has put humanity at the forefront of it all, making us a little less than angels, "crowned with glory and honor" (Psalm 8:6).

SJB RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Regular registrations for the 2010-2011 year will be held on Sunday, August 22nd from 9:00am to 1:00pm. The following is what we will be offering:

Pre-K 4 and Kindergarten age children: Classes are held on Sunday morning from 10:30 to 11:45am. Parents must pick up their children to attend the 12:00 noon Mass as part of their class. It is urged that parents attend this mass.

1st thru 5th grade: Classes are held on Sunday morning from 10:30 to 11:45am with Mass attendance at 12:00 noon. The Mass is part of their class. No child may be picked up prior to Mass. It is requested that the parents attend this mass if possible.

6th thru 8th grades: Classes are held on Sunday morning from 10:30 to 11:45am with Mass attendance at 12:00 noon. The continuing education in the Catholic Faith is essential in these formative years of our children. The children should attend Religious Education classes every year that they attend regular school.

Baptism classes for children 6 and older: Classes are held on Sunday morning from 10:30 to 11:45am. The children will attend the Liturgy of the Word at 12:00 noon and be dismissed after the homily to discuss the readings and the gospel. The children will be dismissed at 1:00pm.

Communion classes: Classes are held on Sunday morning from 10:30 to 11:45am. Attendance at the 12:00 noon Mass is part of the learning process for these classes. Parents are encouraged to attend this same Mass.

Rite of Christian Initiation for adults: Adults interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church, please contact Rosalinda Rodriguez in the Faith Formation office. The RCIA is a process that invites the baptized and un-baptized, non-Catholic and Catholic adults, who have questions about the Catholic Faith or wish to complete their sacraments of initiation. The process is individualized as much as possible to meet the needs and life experiences of each adult.

NEW CAFETERIA POLICY

Due to the many problems we encountered by those who have used the cafeteria and /or kitchen in the recent past, the Pastoral Council has decided to place new rules on the usage of these facilities. Starting immediately all church and school organizations that use these facilities will pay the following charge(s):

\$50.00 dollars to use the kitchen

\$50.00 dollars to clean the kitchen

\$50.00 to clean the dining room and put the tables and chairs back in their proper place

Renters will only be charged for the area they use and full payment is due at the time the area is booked. Renters are also responsible for a general cleaning of the area they uses. All reservations and payments will be made at the rectory office. The money paid for use of the kitchen will be saved and used when a repair or replacement becomes necessary. This payment will not cover the entire cost of repairs and maintenance to the kitchen facilities but it will help a little.
