BE LIKE THE SAMARITAN

July 11, 2010

The parable in today's Gospel is one of the best known of all the teachings of Jesus. The term "Good Samaritan" has been used to name various charitable organizations and is even the official name of one state's emergency roadside assistance program that helps stranded motorists. With the prevalence of the terminology used to describe various activities in our day, we might be led to forget the message of this Gospel passage. This man, this Samaritan, was the only one who offered the beaten man help. Samaritans, remember, were considered the lowest of the low in the time of Christ. A good Jewish person would not even have gone near a Samaritan for fear of being rendered impure. The Samaritan was motivated solely by the sense that the poor man needed help. He didn't care about religious or social status. And Jesus' message is that we are to do the same.

ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

In 1263 a German priest was on pilgrimage to Rome when he stopped to celebrate mass in a church along the way. He was a good and holy man but he had begun to have doubts about the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. When he lifted the host at the consecration the host began to bleed and he doubted no more! Some years before this a Belgian nun, St. Juliana of Mont Cornillon, had a vision of the Church under a full moon with a dark spot that signified the lack of a feast day for the Holy Eucharist. She urged her bishop and later the pope to create one. This feast is the one day of the liturgical year dedicated to the Most Blessed Sacrament, the sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ. In many places it is a major event with special processions and celebrations. **In our chapel we celebrate Corpus Christi every third Thursday of the month from 9:00am to 5:00pm. Please make plans to come and spend some time with our Lord Thursday, July 15th.**

SJB RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Registration for religious education will be held on Sunday, August 22nd from 9:00am to 1:00pm. The following is what we will be offering:

Pre-K 4 and Kindergarten age children: Classes are held on Sunday morning from 10:30 to 11:45am. Parents must pick up their children to attend the 12:00 noon Mass as part of their class. It is urged that parents attend this mass.

First thru fifth grade: Classes are held on Sunday morning from 10:30 to 11:45am with Mass attendance at 12:00 noon. The Mass is part of their class. No child may be picked up prior to Mass. It is requested that the parents attend this mass if possible.

Sixth thru eight grades: Classes are held on Sunday morning from 10:30 to 11:45am with Mass attendance at 12:00 noon. The continuing education in the Catholic Faith is essential in these formative years of our children. The children should attend Religious Education classes every year that they attend regular school.

Baptism classes for children 6 and older: Classes are held on Sunday morning from 10:30 to 11:45am. The children will attend the Liturgy of the Word at 12:00 noon and be dismissed after the homily to discuss the readings and the gospel. The children will be dismissed at 1:00pm.

Communion classes: Classes are held on Sunday morning from 10:30 to 11:45am. Attendance at the 12:00 noon Mass is part of the learning process for these classes. Parents are encouraged to attend this same Mass.

Rite of Christian Initiation for adults: Adults interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church, please contact Rosalinda Rodriguez in the Faith Formation office. The RCIA is a process that invites the baptized and unbaptized, non-Catholic and Catholic adults, who have questions about the Catholic Faith or wish to complete their sacraments of initiation. The process is individualized as much as possible to meet the needs and life experiences of each adult.
